

Revelation Week 11 October 27 | Weekly Devotionals

OPEN with prayer.

Begin this devotional exercise by finding a quiet place where you can spend time with God in his word. Before reading, pray that the Holy Spirit would open your eyes and heart to what God wants to say to you.

READ Revelation 15:1-20:15.

REFLECT

- In Revelation 17-18, Babylon represents a corrupt and seductive system opposed to God. How do you identify modern-day "Babylons" in your life—systems, habits, or influences that draw you away from God? What steps can you take to distance yourself from them? In what ways do you need to "come out" (18:1) of Babylon today?
- Revelation 19:11-21 presents a powerful image of Christ's final victory over evil. How does this vision of Jesus as the conquering King affect your confidence in him? How can this perspective influence the way you face spiritual battles in your life?

• Revelation 20:12-15 speaks of the Book of Life. Reflect on the significance of having your name written in this book. How does this truth impact your daily choices, priorities, and relationships?
